Temporary Independent Living Facility

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Presentation of the KAP Project

Many “young people”, when facing difficulties within their family or even a major crisis, find themselves “homeless”, with all the risks that such a situation entails and the difficulties involved in finding accommodation again, even on a temporary basis.

CEMO¹, in partnership with various social housing agencies (AIS), provides several fully equipped accommodations for its target group.

Our project aims to offer an independent living environment. The objective is to create the necessary conditions for educational and psychosocial support, enabling comprehensive work to resolve the situation and support future prospects (family situation, education, transition to independent living, etc.). Accommodation is provided alongside individual support.

Our project enables support work aimed at developing independence and is not an emergency accommodation solution.

The duration of the accommodation is variable and will depend on the project established for each beneficiary². KAP is also organised across several locations, each with its own specific features³.

Target group

Our apartments are primarily intended for:

- Young people aged between 16 and 18 years old (with the possibility of an extension if they were supported before turning 18) who do not have stable accommodation, are living on the streets or in a similar situation, and are experiencing a breakdown and/or crisis with their usual living environment.

We also have the possibility of accommodating other people for whom support from our service remains appropriate.

This includes:

- A minor parent with a child⁴
- A parent (aged 18–25) with a child
- A young person under the age of 25

Regardless of the target group, the following criteria must be met:

- No stable accommodation
- Living on the streets or in a similar situation
- Experiencing a breakdown and/or crisis with their usual living environment
- Having a valid residence status for a period at least equal to the maximum duration of accommodation (one year from the date of entry into the accommodation)

Particular attention is given to the different vulnerabilities experienced by the young person.

Admission procedures

Accommodation in one of our transitional apartments necessarily includes support from our service and the acceptance of the framework that has been established:

- Request and motivation from the beneficiary regarding the project, as well as agreement to the psychosocial support provided
- Attendance at the four admission interviews (including one with the legal guardian if the young person is a minor)
- Commitment to respect the collaboration agreement
- Willingness to engage in a process of personal development and change
- Authorisation from the legal guardian if the young person is a minor

Financial Aspects

The monthly financial contribution for our KAP accommodation units is determined according to the AIS rent scale, depending on the type of accommodation (studio and one-bedroom apartment).

This rental contribution includes an amount for rent, a provision for charges, and, where applicable, an amount allocated to monthly savings.

These amounts therefore vary depending on the type of accommodation: smaller units, with lower rent and charges, may for example allow the beneficiary to build up savings.

Duration of accommodation

The person accommodated may stay for a different length of time depending on the type of support programme they are part of.

Our “KAP Transit” independent living support project is based on a maximum accommodation period of one year. An initial three-month period is agreed upon, which can be renewed up to three times. Each period is evaluated, and any extension will depend on how well the project meets the needs of the beneficiary, as well as compliance with the overall framework and the collaboration agreement.

Our KAP Short-Term and Stabilisation projects allow the beneficiary to stay for a variable period of time depending on their needs and specific vulnerabilities. The individual situation of each beneficiary will be analysed by the professionals supporting the application.

The procedure : three key stages

The application

This requires a period of meetings and reflection, which takes place through various interviews spread over several weeks. This period allows the beneficiary to engage with the project and enables us to assess whether the request is appropriate and to identify the candidate's specific needs.

The stay and support

The beneficiary's personal project will always be at the heart of our support. They will receive intensive support from our professionals. Meetings take place on a weekly basis, and thematic workshops are also organised.

The suitability of the support provided within KAP is regularly assessed with the beneficiary and the partners within the network.

Preparation for leaving the programme

We will support the beneficiary in the steps related to their chosen future project.

Some restrictions

Our working framework means that we cannot accept all types of applicants:

- The beneficiary's "lack of commitment" to the support project is an obstacle to joining our programme.
- Requests concerning situations of serious and recurring danger, for which placement is recommended, will not be accepted.



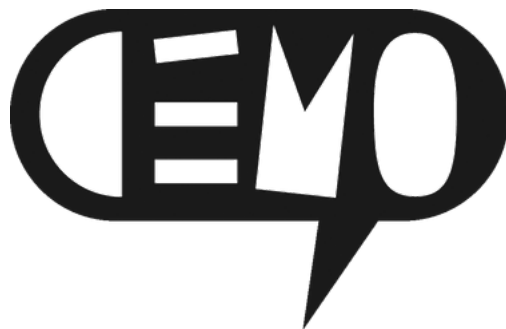
